READ: *Number One Sam* by Greg Pizzoli

Race Day by Gail Tuchman

Beep, Beep, Vroom, Vroom by Stuart J. Murphy

TALK:

Everyone stands to stretch.

1. "Raise your arms up high." (say in high voice)
2. "Take your arms down low." (say in low, deep voice)
3. "Shake your hands behind your back." (regular voice)
4. "Shake your hands in front of your belly." (regular voice)
5. Repeat first four lines then say "Sit back down."

PLAY:

Copy Cat - As leader, tell the children to stand. They are to watch you and copy what you do. Don't speak; just make motions. Examples: nod your head, shrug your shoulders, flap your arms, wiggle your hips bend your knees, tap your toes, sit back down

SING:

"Good Morning to You" (tune: Happy Birthday)

"Let's Go Driving" (tune: Frere Jacques)

Let's go driving, let's go driving (hands on imaginary steering wheel) Around the block, around the block.

We will keep on driving, we will keep on driving,

And then we'll stop, and then we'll stop (foot on the brake, make screeching sound) *NOTE: sing this song three times:

first time regular voice, second time loud, third time whisper.

WRITE:

Have the groups dip toys cars into paint and make tracks on paper.

Early Literacy Tip:

Play with your child! Children learn language through play and conversations with adults. A good vocabulary will help your child learn to read more easily, because it is easier to learn to read words you already know the meaning of when listening and speaking.
